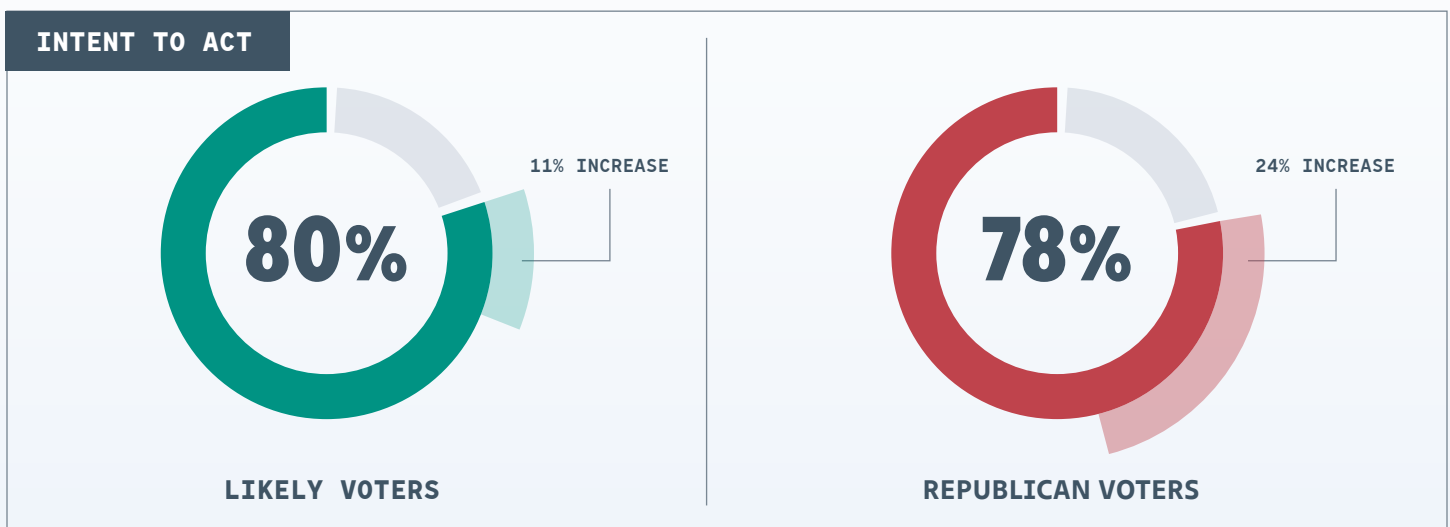


## INTRODUCTION

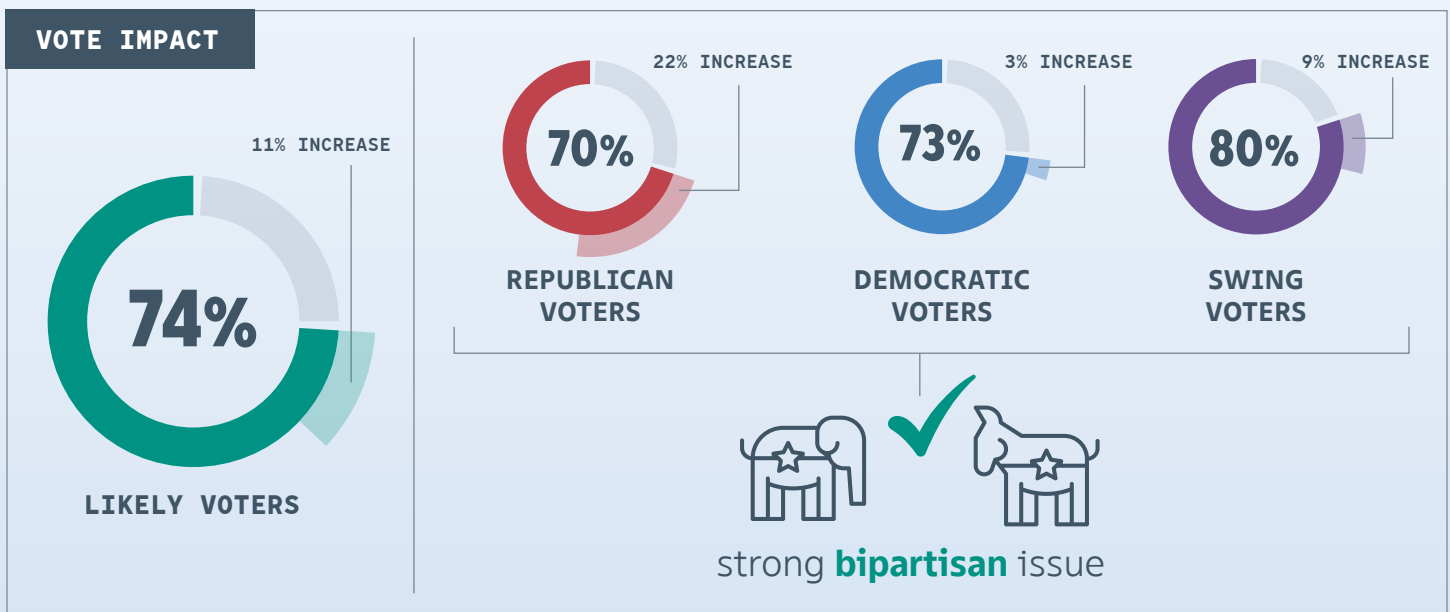
The Gulf Coast CCS Alliance’s public opinion tracking survey of likely voters in the Houston metro area shows that awareness and opinion of carbon capture and storage (CCS) technology and the Houston CCS Hub has improved significantly since September 2021 – especially among Republican voters.

## POLITICAL IMPACT

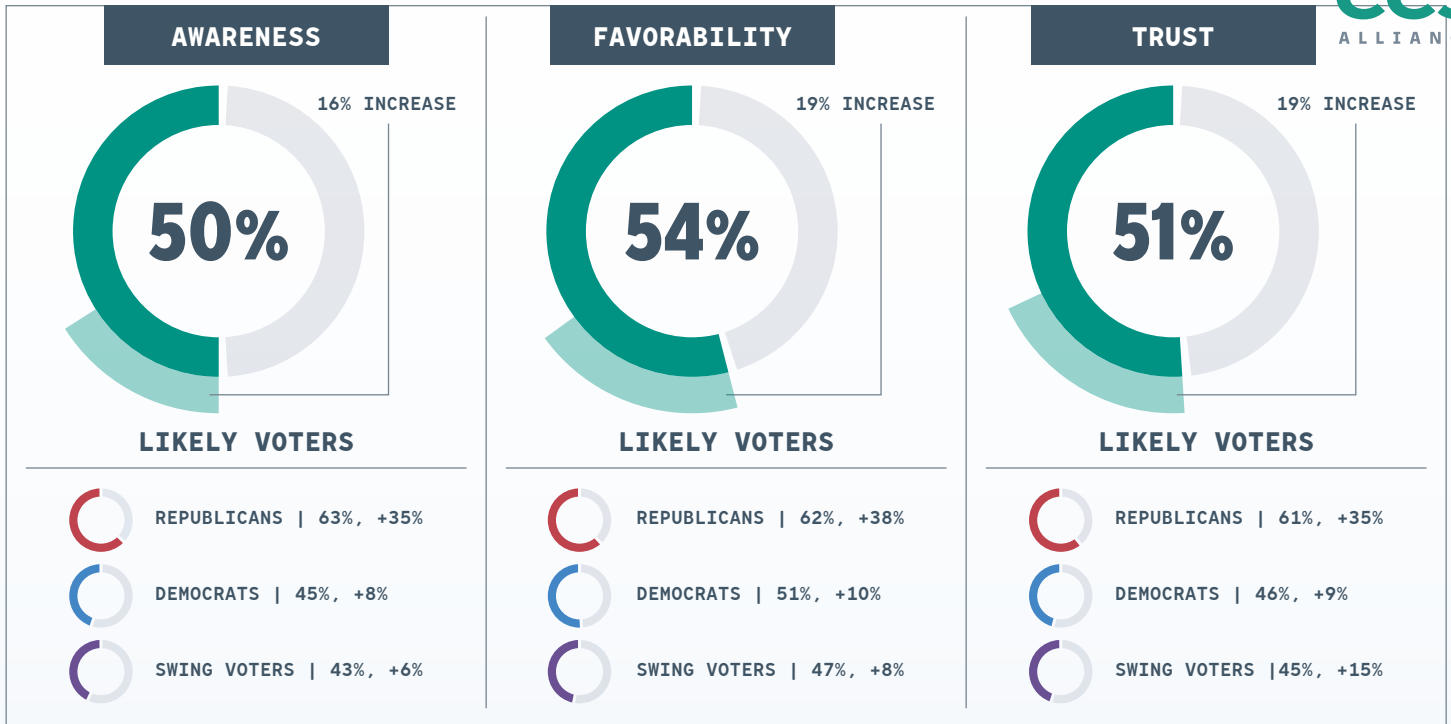
Willingness to take action in support of the creation of the Houston Hub – such as contacting a lawmaker, signing a petition, talking to friends or family, or posting on social media - has **INCREASED** significantly – and grown most among Republican voters.



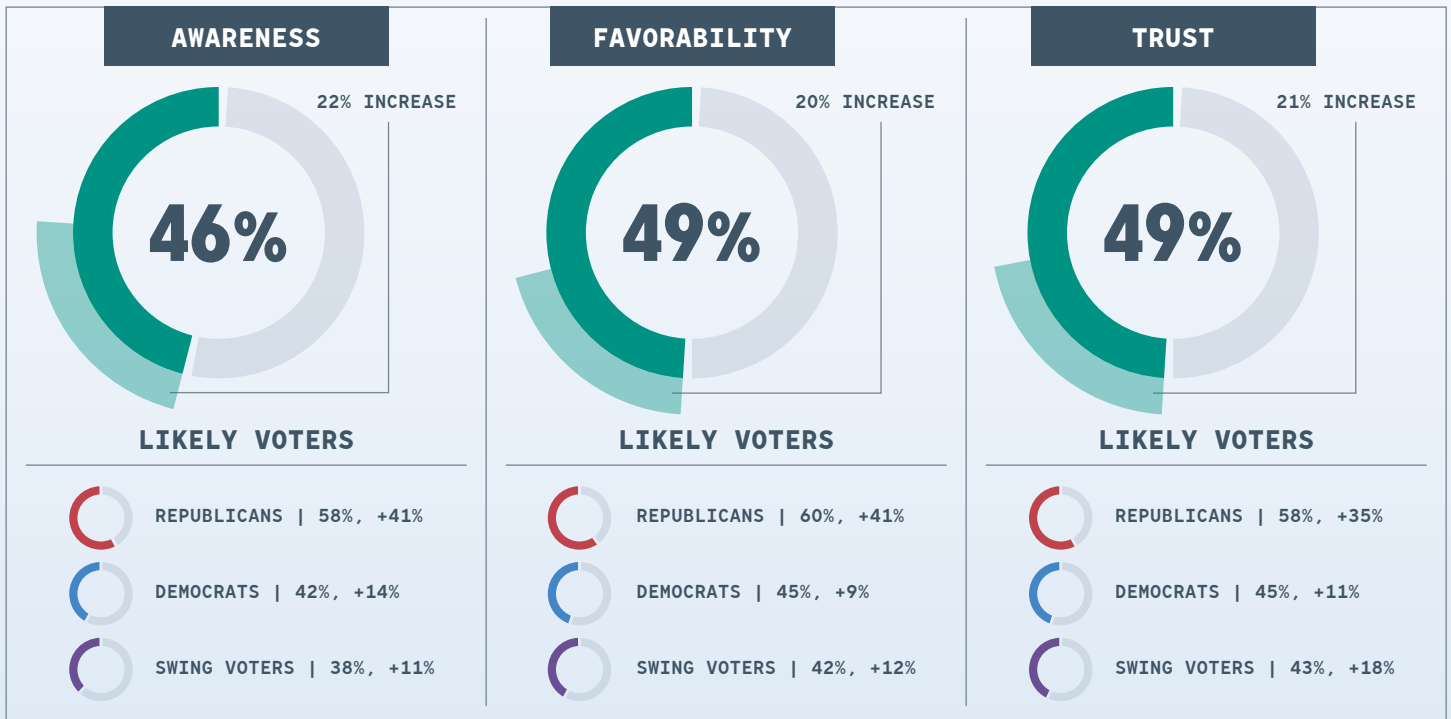
Most Houston-area likely voters would be **MORE** likely to vote for an elected official if they support the construction of large-scale CCS infrastructure, including a majority of Republican, Democratic, and swing voters – making this a strong **BIPARTISAN** issue.
